ORDINANCE NO. 350 - 2018

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 158, SECTION 9 OF THE CAPE MAY CITY MUNICIPAL CODE, REGULATING BICYCLES ON THE PROMENADE

WHEREAS, Chapter 158 of the Cape May Municipal Code regulates activities on Cape May's beaches, boardwalks and promenades; and

WHEREAS, Section 158-9 of the Code prohibits certain activities on the Cape May Promenade, including operation of bicycles during certain times; and

WHEREAS, having carefully considered the matter, the Cape May City Council desires to amend Section 158-9(A)(3) of the Code to extend the time when bicycles can be operated on the Promenade,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Cape May, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows (additions underlined; deletions [in brackets]):

1. The averments of the preamble are incorporated into this Ordinance.
2. Section 158-9(A)(3) of the Cape May Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

Ride, park or take any bicycle from May 16 [1]to [October 31] September 14
except between the hours of 4:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.

3. This Ordinance shall supersede all other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with it.
4. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

5. This Ordinance shall take effect within twenty (20) days of final passage and publication as provided by law.

**A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A MUNICIPAL PARKING ADVISORY
COMMITTEE TO REVIEW TRAFFIC FLOW AND PARKING ISSUES AND
RECOMMEND IMPROVEMENTS**

MOTION:

SECOND:

WHEREAS, the City of Cape May is increasingly renowned as a treasured historic preservation site and popular tourist destination, and

WHEREAS, over time, the City has grown from a traditional, three-month visitor and tourist season to a ten-month season; and

WHEREAS, the need for improved traffic flow and additional parking spaces has been a perennial concern; and

WHEREAS, an inventory and assessment of the City's traffic flow and parking spaces is in order; and

WHEREAS, there may be at least three definitive areas of parking concerns, including beachfront, residential and business/commercial; and

WHEREAS, it would be beneficial to encourage year-round and seasonal residents and visitors to offer their parking experiences and suggestions; and

WHEREAS, it is important for the City to seek short-term fixes and long-term solutions to parking problems and concerns; and

WHEREAS, an advisory committee of persons representative of business interests, including lodging, dining and shopping elements; residential areas and neighborhoods; joined by other interested, knowledgeable citizens could offer useful insights, guidance and recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, by the City of Cape May, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey that:

1. The Recital paragraphs are incorporated as if fully set forth.
2. The City Council hereby creates and establishes a "Municipal Parking Advisory Committee," whose members and duties are described below.
3. The members of the Committee shall be:

4. The Council may from time to time appoint additional committee members as appropriate.
5. The Committee shall be advisory in function.
6. The Committee shall meet periodically, and will report to the City Manager and City Council on a regular basis or at the request of the Manager or Council.
7. Committee members shall serve without compensation, but the Committee may request, and Council may allocate funds to defray the Committee's legitimate expenses.
8. The Committee shall exist and perform its designated advisory functions until dissolved by resolution of City Council.
9. The Committee shall assist and advise the City Manager and City Council on such matters as:
 - A. Reviewing available traffic and parking studies and reports, the City's Master Plan and other related documents to understand persistent issues, significant trends and recommended solutions;
 - B. Understanding the distinct parking concerns of year-round and seasonal homeowners, beach-goers, hotel-owners and staff, innkeepers and staff, restaurant-owners and staff, Mall and other area business operators and staff, bicyclists, delivery and lawn services, and public safety interests;
 - C. Exploring the availability of grant money or other funding resources to create additional parking spaces and make improvements to existing surface parking resources;
 - D. Surveying relevant groups of stakeholders to understand comparative advantages and disadvantages of parking garage construction and additional surface parking lots including location and size;
 - E. Reviewing the City's metered parking policies and recommending improvements as needed;
 - F. Reviewing and recommending action on parking-related plans in the City's existing Master Plan and the evolving Master Plan Reexamination.
 - G. Soliciting public review and comment.

WHEREAS, the parties desire to outline their respective rights and responsibilities associated with such shared services, pursuant to the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, subject to confirmation by Resolution of the governing body of each entity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Cape May as follows:

1. The averments of the preamble are incorporated into this Resolution.
2. The City is hereby authorized to enter into the attached Shared Services Agreement with the Cape May County Library Commission.

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2018, the Council of the City of Cape May adopted Resolution 131-05-2018 authorizing and directing the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to execute any and all documents pertaining to the Shared Services Agreement between Cape May and the Borough of West Cape May for a Municipal Court Administrator who shall be an employee of the Borough of West Cape May; and

WHEREAS, at the direction of Council the Shared Services Agreement between Cape May and the Borough of West Cape May for a Municipal Court Administrator was executed on behalf of the City of Cape May; and

WHEREAS, after the execution of the Shared Services Agreement for municipal Court Administrator by the appropriate authorities on behalf of Cape May the two municipalities discussed in detail paragraph 6, page 4, of the Agreement and agreed on a revised contract effective date for a two percent (2%) salary increase whereby it has been agreed that the two percent (2%) raise would take effect on January 1, 2019 for a salary of \$69,870.00 for the time period of January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019 and therefore the Borough of West Cape May revised the Shared Services Agreement for Municipal Court Administrator to reflect same prior to execution of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, on May 9, 2018 the Borough of West Cape May adopted Resolution #105-18 authorized the execution of the revised Shared Services Agreement between Cape May and the Borough of West Cape May for a Municipal Court Administrator; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City of Cape May and the Borough of West Cape May to enter into the revised Shared Services Agreement for which will supersede and replace the terms and conditions of the previous Shared Services Agreement for a Municipal Court Administrator hereabove referenced.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Cape May, in the County of Cape May, and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. All of the statements of the preamble are incorporated herein by this reference thereto as though the same were set forth at length.



**A RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE INSTALLATION OF SECURITY CAMERAS
AT THE VICTORIAN TOWERS COMPLEX**

WHEREAS, Victorian Towers, located at 608 Washington Street, in the City of Cape May, is a 205-unit senior affordable apartment building, owned and operated by the Diocese of Camden, through its subsidiary Diocesan Housing Services Corporation, and is home to many of Cape May's senior citizen residents; and

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Cape May City Council that there exists a growing problem at the Towers with vandalism, and with the theft of packages mailed to residents of the Towers; and

WHEREAS, the residents of Victorian Towers, through their Tenants' Association, have made it known to City Council that they desire security or surveillance cameras to be installed in the hallways, elevators and common areas at the complex, both to deter crime and vandalism and as an aid to identifying and capturing the perpetrators of this activity; and

WHEREAS, the residents have asked the Council's assistance and support in persuading the Diocese to install these security cameras; and

WHEREAS, having considered the matter, the City Council believes it appropriate that it support the residents in their effort to have security cameras installed at the facility,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Cape May as follows:

1. The averments of the Preamble are incorporated herein.
2. The Cape May City Council hereby endorses and supports the efforts of the Victorian Towers tenants to have security or surveillance cameras installed in the hallways, elevators and common areas of the facility, to address the concerns about crime and vandalism there, to deter such crime and vandalism, and as an aid in identifying and capturing those who engage in such activity.
3. The Cape May City Clerk is directed to send a copy of this Resolution to the Diocese of Camden, and specifically to the Diocesan Housing Services Corporation, so that the Diocese is fully aware of the Council's interest in this issue and its support of the tenants' request.
