**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT FOR USE OF THE SOCCER FIELD
AT LAFAYETTE STREET PARK**

MOTION:

SECOND:

WHEREAS, the City of Cape May is the tenant, and the Cape May City Elementary School District is the owner, of certain lands adjacent to the Cape May City Elementary School on Lafayette Street in Cape May, which lands include a soccer field; and

WHEREAS, the Recreation Department of the Township of Lower has asked the City for permission to use that soccer field for its youth soccer program between April 1, 2019, through June 9, 2019; and

WHEREAS, in the spirit of municipal comity and cooperation, the City is willing to grant the Township that permission, subject to certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, the School District, as owner of the property, is also willing to permit the Township to use the fields, subject to those same conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Cape May as follows:

1. The averments of the preamble are incorporated by reference.
2. The City Council hereby agrees to permit the Lower Township Recreation Department to use the Lafayette Street Park soccer field for its youth soccer program between April 1, 2019, through June 9, 2019. The Township's use shall be limited to that purpose.
3. The hours of use shall be from 5:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. from Monday through Friday, and from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturdays.
4. Lower Township shall not pay a fee for use of the field but will reimburse the City for all maintenance costs caused by its use beyond normal wear and tear.
5. Lower Township shall furnish proof of insurance acceptable to the City and the School District and will name the City and the School District as an additional insured on all relevant policies.
6. Lower Township shall execute the City's standard use of facilities agreement, including its hold harmless and indemnification provisions.
7. Lower Township shall not schedule use of the field that conflicts with any pre-existing use by the City or School District, or with any event previously scheduled by the City or the School District.

8. Lower Township shall sign a Use Agreement that embodies these conditions, and that Agreement shall also be signed by the School District.

9. The appropriate City officials are hereby authorized to sign a Use Agreement that embodies these conditions, and to take all steps necessary to consummate this arrangement.

10. This Resolution shall take effect immediately, according to law.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION FOR MUNICIPAL
RECYCLING TONNAGE GRANT FOR THE YEAR 2018**

SECOND:

WHEREAS, the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c.102, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grants may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent and spirit of the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling programs and to continue and expand existing programs; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection is promulgating recycling regulations to implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and

WHEREAS, the recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including, but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

WHEREAS, a resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for such tonnage grants for the calendar year 2016 will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and indicate the assent of the City Council of the City of Cape May to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

WHEREAS, such resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure that the application is properly completed and timely filed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Cape May, that Cape May City hereby endorses the submission of a Municipal Recycling Tonnage Grant Application to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and designates Patricia D'Arco, or her designated representative, to ensure that the Application is properly filed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the monies received from the recycling tonnage grant be used solely for the purposes of recycling.

**RESOLUTION REJECTING BIDS – CURBSIDE COLLECTION
OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS**

MOTION:

SECOND:

WHEREAS, the City of Cape May (the “City”) advertised for the receipt of bids for the curbside collection of recyclable materials; and

WHEREAS, two sealed bids were received on February 5, 2019, as follows: 1) from Gold Medal Environmental of New Jersey, Inc., in the amount of \$548,523; and 2) from Waste Management of New Jersey, Inc., in the amount of \$550,608; and

WHEREAS, both bids were approximately 300% higher than the amount the City has been paying for curbside collection of recyclables under its previous contract; and

WHEREAS, both bids, including the lower bid submitted by Gold Medal, are substantially in excess of the City’s cost estimates for the service and substantially in excess of the City’s proposed appropriation for the service; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2 permits a municipality to reject all bids for a service if those bids are either substantially in excess of its cost estimate for the service, or substantially in excess of its appropriation for the service; and

WHEREAS, the City consequently desires, and has determined, to reject the two bids received.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Cape May, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The two bids received on February 5, 2019, for the curbside collection of recyclable materials, from Gold Medal Environmental and Waste Management, are hereby rejected for the following reasons:

- A. The bids are substantially in excess of the City’s cost estimate for the service.
- B. The bids are substantially in excess of the amount the City proposed to appropriate for the service.

2. This Resolution shall take effect immediately, according to law.
