Cape May City Elementary School students to help the victims of Haiti

The Student Council of Cape May City Elementary School, in conjunction with Food for the Poor, Inc., is conducting a drive to collect money or supplies to assist the victims of Haiti.

During the week of Mon., Jan. 25 to Fri., Jan. 29, the school is collecting the following items that will go to Burke, Virginia at the beginning of February:

Powdered/canned milk, canned fish, meat and vegetables, diapers, bandages, band aides, hand sanitizers, antibiotic ointments, toothbrushes, and toothpaste. Pharmaceuticals/medicines are also being collected but are not to be brought in by children.

“Collected items will be transported to Burke, Virginia by Our Lady of Angel Social Justice Group of Cape May County where a 40 ft. container will ship out to Haiti fully loaded the 1st week of February,” said Ann Herron, spokesperson for the group.

Cape May City Elementary School will be a drop off point between the hours of 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, Jan. 25-29, for any resident of the City who wishes to help.

“Any support you could give would be greatly appreciated,” said Mr. R. Anthony Doto, Cape May City Elementary 6th grade teacher and Student Council Moderator. “The 4th and 6th graders decided to give up their Valentine’s Day parties and donated \$100 to Food for the Poor instead.”
