<p><b>Fisherman's Memorial (FM)</b> N 38° 56.704 W 074° 54.205 This is a memorial dedicated to all those lost at sea, including the recent Lady Mary accident. Geocache at site</p>	<p><b>Cape May Park (CMP)</b> N 38° 56.698 W 074° 54.954 This is a small park with a pond and a playground that is located across the street from the Cape May Water Tower.</p>
<p><b>Texas Avenue Park (TAP)</b> N 38° 56.833 W 074° 54.334 This is a nice scenic overlook of the harbor that has Gazebos and benches for you to relax at. Geocache at site</p>	<p><b>Physick Estate (PE)</b> N 38° 56.456 W 074° 54.889 Come see a historic Victorian landmark that has stood the test of time and is now a museum open to the public.</p>

## DRIVING DISTANCE

<p><b>Cape May Bird Observatory (CMBO)</b> N 38° 56.414 W 074° 57.748 Founded in 1975 by the New Jersey Audubon Society, the Cape May Bird Observatory (CMBO) is a leader in research, environmental education, bird conservation, and recreational birding activities.</p>	<p><b>Higbees Beach (HB)</b> N 38° 57.690 W 074° 57.619 If you like nature, the beach, and having fun with the family, then Higbees beach is the right place to go. From the parking lot, you can go on a nature walk through the forestry or sunbathe and watch the Ferry go by.</p>
<p><b>Nature Conservancy "The Meadows" (NC)</b> N 38° 56.296 W 074° 56.670 Come walk through the dunes and join in on one of Cape May hottest birding spots. You can see the beach or go to one of the platforms that are available.</p>	<p><b>The Cove (COVE)</b> N 38° 55.801 W 074° 56.067 This is one of the hottest wave spots on the Cape May beach line. This spot is a favorite for beachcombing and sunbathing due to its size and hard sand. If you are up to the hike, you can walk to the Lighthouse.</p>
<p><b>WWII Fire Tower (WW2FT)</b> N 38° 56.627 W 074° 57.982 This is a newly restored Fire Control Tower that was used in WWII. You can go to the top and along the way look at the museum inside to see exactly what role this tower had in the war.</p>	<p><b>Cape May Point (CMPT)</b> N 38° 55.973 W 074° 57.535 In this area you have a multitude of things that you can do and see. You can go up the lighthouse, visit a museum, go on the beach, or walk some Nature trails. There is plenty of parking and plenty to see.</p>
<p><b>Sunset beach (SB)</b> N 38° 56.661 W 074° 58.193 One of the most beautiful places to be at sunset, this area also includes a place to eat, a gift shop, and also the concrete ship. Flag ceremonies are held everyday during the summer.</p>	<p><b>The Beanery "Rea Farm" (BEAN)</b> N 38° 56.806 W 074° 56.385 The Rea Farm is one of the premier sites for observing migrating birds in Cape May. If you are not a member of CMBO/NJAS, then you will need to go to the Cape May Bird Observatory (CMBO) to purchase a pass.</p>
